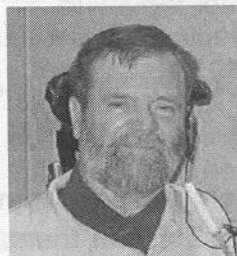

O'Well Cup Awarded to René Dallaire

Bert Weller was a member of PCYC for many years and one of the Club's most avid sailors and racers in his Shark, O'Well. He also encouraged many young sailors, as our Past Commodore, Tony

McBride will attest. Bert also brought much fame and glory to PCYC as a world-class race manager. We were all very proud when he was selected as an official measurer for the 1976 Olympics. Unfortunately he became gravely ill during the Olympics and died shortly afterward.

To honour his memory, a number of PCYC members deeded a trophy in his name: the O'Well trophy. Originally, it was for the winner in Quarter-Ton competition. Quarter-tons were a class of boat including the Mirage 24 and a slightly modified Tanzer 22. The Quarter-ton concept died out and the trophy was re-deeded for someone who has made a significant contribution to sailing. A past recipient was Peter Bauer, who has done so much at the Club to encourage junior sailing. It is one of the most important trophies presented to a PCYC member.



I am no longer a member of the Advisory Board, but I certainly endorse their choice of René as this year's recipient. His contribution to sailing is immense. By introducing disabled sailing to Quebec, in proud partnership with PCYC, he

has provided hundreds of individuals with physical disabilities the opportunity to enjoy the sport the rest of us take for granted. One only has to look around the dry sail area of the Club or on the deck to see René's impact on so many people. It came with a great deal of effort, management skills, and dedication on René's part to bring this dream to fruition. He has also encouraged other local chapters, such as a thriving group in the Sherbrooke area. René's efforts have not only provided some disabled individuals with a new form of recreation, but also contributed to improvement of their quality of life by breaking down feelings of isolation through social contacts and accomplishments achieved.
